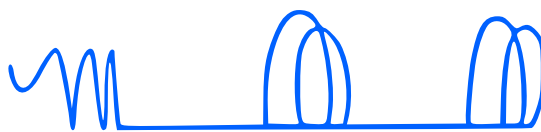

STANDING ORDER ON VIRTUAL COURT APPEARANCES

All individuals appearing virtually for Court before Judge Corcilli, whether parties, including pro-se, or self-represented, attorneys, witnesses, or friends/family of a defendant, are hereby ordered to:

1. Exhibit correct courtroom decorum, including being appropriately dressed (no sleeveless tops, no non-prescription sunglasses, no hats on men) and refraining from eating/drinking, smoking/vaping, chewing gum or tobacco, driving/operating heavy machinery or otherwise being engaged in any distracting task;
2. Ensure his/her name appears correctly on the screen when joining Zoom. This means a participant might have to “rename” himself/herself to reflect his/her correct name;
3. Use appropriate backgrounds, virtual or actual, and appropriate profile photos when video is turned off (no explicit or offensive language or images);
4. Refrain from speaking out or “unmuting” his/her microphone when his/her case is not being addressed, or otherwise needlessly interrupting court proceedings (remain on mute until your case is called);
5. Defendants shall turn on their video, unmute themselves, and state their name clearly for the record when their case is called;
6. Refrain from sending direct messages to the judge on the chat; and
7. Abide by any other directives given by the judge and/or the bailiff/court specialist.
